A Prayer Guide for the week of June 28

Prayer of the week:

Consider using the prayer of the Psalmist from Psalm 119:5 as a springboard for your own prayer time this week. If you're praying through the church directory, this is a great prayer to use as you pray for your church family this week.

"⁵Oh that my ways may be steadfast in keeping your statutes!

We recognize our need for God's help in all the areas of our lives. The categories and requests listed below are intentional ways to pray for each other as a church family. For help in knowing how and what to pray for, look up the Scripture included with each item.

Ongoing prayer items in the life of our church:

- Pray for opportunities and boldness to share the gospel with friends, family, co-workers (Matt. 28:19)
- Pray for conversions (John 3:3, Acts 16:14)
- Pray for the preaching of God's word for faithfulness, fruitfulness, and God's glory (2 Tim. 4:2, 1 Cor. 2:4-5, Isa. 55:10-11)
- Pray for the children of our church to hear and understand the gospel and be saved (Luke 8:8)
- Pray for increased one to one discipleship relationships in our church family (Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for unity in our diversity both on Sunday and through the week (Rom. 15:13, Eph. 4:2-3)
- Pray for continued growth and joy in the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-5, 2 Pet. 1:12)
- Pray for growth in holiness, hatred of sin and growth in humility (Prov. 8:13, 1 Pet. 1:14-16)
- Pray for honest, loving relationships in our church (Col. 3:12-13, James 5:16)
- Pray for families: marriages to thrive, parents to teach/love/discipline carefully, and children to obey (Eph. 5:22-6:4)
- Pray that giving would be faithful, joyful, consistent, and sacrificial (2 Cor. 8:9)

Prayer items outside our church:

- Pray for hope and healing in our nation as we lament and grieve over recent effects of injustice and racism.
 (Prov 6:16-19; Ps 77:1-3)
- Pray that God would help government leaders locally and nationally to make wise decisions going forward that will help protect all people from evil and unjust suffering. (1 Tim. 2:1-2, Rom. 13:1-7)

- Pray for the safety and good health of medical personnel, first responders, and those working on the front lines of contact with those who are suffering with coronavirus.
- Pray that God would provide relief for those suffering from the effects of the virus throughout the world, and that He would draw people to His Word and to salvation. (Ps. 139:23-24)
- Pray for fruitful ministry in other gospel-proclaiming churches in our area even as we are unable to gather together for public worship. (Rom. 15:20, 1 Cor. 16:1-3, Matt. 28:19-20)
- Pray for our missionary partners around the world and especially those we are directly involved with: Mack and LeAnn Stiles (Central Asia), Daniel and Brandi Spandler-Davison (East Asia), and Dave and JoAnn Brown (Guatemala). Pray that the gospel would flourish and churches would be planted and strengthened through their work. Pray God would strengthen their faith and supply their needs. 
Announcements







Outdoor Worship Service Update – 6/17/20

The elders at First Baptist Church of Upper Marlboro are pleased to present some of the details for our plan for holding church services outdoors. On June 15th, Prince George's County entered into phase 2 whereby places of worship can gather for outside services. **Therefore**, we hope to gather for outside services beginning Sunday, June 21st. The following guidance below should answer some of your questions regarding our plans moving forward. Please feel free to contact the church office or any of the elders if you have any questions regarding the plans.

Why are we having our church service outdoors?

The State of Maryland, Prince Georges County, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends churches hold services outdoors due to increased ventilation and more open spaces, thereby creating a safer environment for gathering. While the elders work through the logistics of holding services indoors, this step affords our congregation a safe way of holding worship services at our church. It allows our church to gather during one service, instead of having multiple services due to indoor capacity limitations. It also reduces the amount of preparation, sanitization, and cleaning that the church staff and volunteers would have to conduct before and after the service.

Will we continue online services?

We will continue to offer online services at every phase of the reopening plan so as to accommodate those members who are considered high-risk or are not comfortable gathering. We'll live-stream the service at 9:30 AM.

What will an outdoor service be like?

An outdoor worship service will begin as an abbreviated version of our indoor services (approximately one hour). We'll worship through song, giving, prayer, and the reading and preaching of God's Word. [In July, we hope to celebrate the Lord's Supper together, but instead of passing the plate, we will use individually sealed, self-contained bread/juice cups. We'll have more information on this later on...]

What time will the outdoor service begin?

We plan on beginning the service at **9:30 AM**. Consider arriving at least 20-30 minutes early to set up your spot. Placing a sheet or blanket (or chairs) down clearly signals your distance from others.

Should I bring my own chair?

Church members should bring their own outdoor chairs or blankets to sit on. This will help with setup and take down of the service and will reduce the amount of sanitization that the church staff and volunteers will be required to complete.

Where can I sit?

We will have clearly marked entry and exit points out of the seating areas (see maps on pg. 5-6). We will have open-seating, encourage families (or individuals from the same household) to sit together, and to remain approximately six-feet from other individuals. When the church service is completed, our ushers will lead us in an orderly exit of the seating area.

What if it rains?

In the case of unexpected rain or inclement weather, we will quickly notify the church through phone calls, text messages, website, and social media to notify church members (on Saturday night) that the service will be livestreamed on Sunday morning instead of us meeting outside.

Will I have to wear a mask during the service?

In order to show love and care for our neighbors (especially those who may be at a higher risk of the virus), we're asking all attendees (2 years old and up) to wear a mask. Wearing a mask is primarily for the safety of other people. We understand there are different opinions on this issue, but our aim is to do everything we can to provide a safe environment, so the maximum number of people can attend and feel safe during the service. (The church will provide a limited number of masks for those who forget to bring theirs).

Will there be childcare during the service?

For our initial re-opening we are not able to offer childcare. Children are of course welcome, but we encourage families and households to sit together during the service and not to allow kids to roam.

How should we greet one another?

For a church body, this may be the most <u>difficult</u> aspect of our regathering back together. Although we will desire to shake hands and hug one another, we are asking that we follow social distancing requirements, stay approximately six-feet away from each other since we are still in a pandemic. Although you may feel more comfortable with being close to others, individuals at a higher risk of the virus may not feel comfortable.

Will there be an offering?

We continue to encourage the use of online giving, but for those who want to give in person, there will be a box (or bucket) that an individual will be holding at the end of the service at the exit point of the seating area.

Will we handout paper bulletins?

We will not have paper bulletins in order to reduce the number of items people touch. We will email the bulletin to our members on Saturday so that you can print them off beforehand or encourage you to bring a device (smartphone or tablet) to read an electronic copy on Sunday.

Will restrooms be available?

We will ensure that two sets of men's and women's restrooms will be available during the service. We will have individuals monitoring the restrooms to ensure the number of individuals in the restrooms are limited and the restroom remains sanitary.

How should I decide if I should I come to the outdoor church service?

We understand there are many factors involved in decisions whether or not to attend public services during this time. No one will be judged for their choice to worship the Lord in person or at home. We will continue to offer online services for those at higher risk for severe illness (including older adults and people of all ages with certain underlying medical conditions) to help limit their exposure risk.

In many instances, especially those at a higher risk, it is the wiser thing to stay at home. If you are experiencing any symptoms, have a temperature, or have been exposed to people who have tested positive for the virus, we would ask that you remain home and watch services online. Although we will not be taking temperatures before the service, those who are actively serving in the service (ushers, worship team, volunteers) will be checked for symptoms.

What is the 'FM Transmitters car park' on the maps?

For those who would like to attend the outdoor service but are not able to join folks in the seating area, we will have a limited number of parking spots available for people to join in the service from their cars. They can either roll down their windows to listen or utilize a FM transmitter where you can tune into the service via your car radio. *For those who'd like to use this option, let the parking attendant know upon arrival for instructions.

When are we going to move the service back indoors?

The elders will continue to monitor federal, state, and local guidance in terms of the phased re-opening. As these details come in and we continue to iron out the details of meeting safely in the building again, we will keep you informed.

What do I need to know before I come?

We will have parking attendants to help people know where to park. We'll also provide hand sanitizing stations in the seating area for our church family to use.

Reminders for All:

- Bring your Bible and note-taking material
- Bring your printed bulletin or smartphone/tablet to view it
- Bring your blanket, sheet, or towel
- Bring your chair
- Bring your sunscreen & bug repellant
- Bring water to drink (and umbrella if you want)

Reminders for Parents:

- Keep a close watch on your kids
- Please do not bring any sports or outdoor game equipment for your kids. The playground at the church will be closed
- Talk to your kids beforehand and practice safe behaviors in advance

We are asking our congregation to PRAY for all the aspects of this service. To pray for unity and humility within our church body and that God would be glorified by our gathering together to worship Him!
